

Guest speaker for the coffee this month will be Kathryn Peterson who is the Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation office in Oklahoma City.

In July 2016, FBI Director James B. Comey appointed Kathryn Peterson as the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of the Oklahoma City Field Office, which covers the state of Oklahoma. Ms. Peterson began her career with the FBI in May 1990 and was first assigned to the Milwaukee Field Office, where she worked criminal and

national security investigations. In 1995, she served a 60-day temporary duty assignment in support of the FBI's investigation of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building bombing. As a member of the Milwaukee Field Office's SWAT team, she also assisted in the manhunt for Olympic Park bomber Eric Rudolph and participated in the Montana Freemen standoff. In 1999, Ms. Peterson was promoted to the position of Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) in the National Security Division at FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ) in Washington, D.C. From 2003 to 2010, Ms. Peterson served in the Chicago Field Office, supervising counterintelligence and counterterrorism investigations. Following assignments as Assistant Section Chief in the Counterterrorism Division at FBI Headquarters and Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Albany Field Office, Ms. Peterson was promoted in 2014 to the Senior Executive Service as an Inspector in the Inspection Division at FBIHQ. In this assignment, she led on-site performance and leadership inspections of field and FBIHQ divisions and conducted agent-involved shooting investigations.


Prior to joining the FBI, Ms. Peterson served as a U.S. Army intelligence analyst in occupied Berlin. She is a graduate of the University of Iowa and the Defense Language Institute, and is a recipient of the Director's Award for Outstanding Counterterrorism Investigation and the National Intelligence Exceptional Achievement Medal. She currently resides in Edmond, Oklahoma.

THE MOTHER OF ALL BOMBS

As the writer sat down to write this commentary, the radio informed him that the US military had just dropped a MOAB (Massive Ordnance Air Blast) bomb in a strike in Afghanistan. Nicknamed the "Mother of All Bombs", MOAB is the largest nonnuclear bomb in the US arsenal. Due to its massive size – 21,000 pounds and 30 feet long – it can't be delivered like other conventional bombs. It is transported within range of its target by a specially modified cargo plane, released, and then remotely guided to its target. One MOAB yields an explosive force equivalent to 11 tons of TNT.

The power of the bomb wasn't limited to battlefield. The MOAB also took over the news cycle. Whatever else the commentators planned on discussing that day fell by the wayside. Pundits debated whether such a show of force was justified and speculated on the political implications of the event. Others wondered if there was justification for such a weapon to exist at all. Throughout the day, world governments weighed in with messages of support or condemnation regarding the use of the bomb. The entire world took notice when a weapon of the magnitude was unleashed.

Psalm 66 explores a different type of might – God's power. God's mighty acts toward Israel were so great that every nation had to take notice and react.







Ward 8 City Councilman Mark Stonecipher is a lifelong resident of Oklahoma City and believes that

neighborhood associations are one of the most vital parts for a strong and successful Oklahoma City. Prior to his election, Mark was involved in the life of this City by serving as President of two different neighborhood associations, serving on the Board of Adjustment and serving as a member of former Mayor Mick Cornett's task force revising the OKC Charter, which is Oklahoma City's governing document.

Mark currently serves as the Vice Mayor of Oklahoma City and has worked closely with Mayor David Holt on some of the most important issues facing the city, including most recently the hiring of new City Manager Craig Freeman.

Since his election in 2015, Mark has worked non-stop to improve Ward 8 by dramatically increasing the number of resurfaced roads, planning and approval of new soccer fields for our children and planning and approval of a new 131-acre park. He has also helped obtain an additional \$3.5 million for an expansion of our new MAPS 3 Senior Health and Wellness Center and, as a member of the City Council, is overseeing the implementation of Better Streets, Safer City, which includes an additional 129 police officers and 57 firefighters to make our community safer. In addition to what roadwork has recently been completed, and the current work being performed, efforts are underway for an additional 52 miles in Ward 8.

A graduate of Heritage Hall High School, Mark received his undergraduate degree from Oklahoma City University and his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Oklahoma. He is an attorney with the Fellers Snider law firm and practices in the areas of oil and gas, land use, environment and business law. Mark has been married to his wife, Debbie, for 36 years. They have lived in Ward 8 almost 30 years, and are members of Crossings Community Church.
